# Nokia takes its relaunched 3310 'brick' home to Finland

NOKIA RELAUNCHED ITS simple but classic 3310 phone in its home market of Finland on Wednesday, hoping a wave of nostalgia may boost the brand as it expands into newer smartphones.

Once the world's dominant phonemaker, Nokia Oyj sold its handset operations to Microsoft in 2014, leaving it to focus on telecoms network equipment.

But its brand has gone back on the mobile market across much of Europe and India thanks to a licensing deal with HMD Global, a new company led by former Nokia executives and backed by Chinese electronics giant Foxconn.

HMD has sole use of the Nokia brand on all phones and tablets for the next decade, and it will pay royalties to Nokia Oyj. Nokia 3310, a basic talk and text phone, was the world's most popular device in 2000 and the first handset owned by many smartphone users of today.

The updated version, in bright red or yellow and featuring the classic Snake game, sells for 49 euros (\$52).

HMD hopes that its 22 hours of talk time and up to one month of standby time will heighten its appeal for customers looking for a break from smartphone overload or a reliable device for lively nights out.

Initial demand appears to be strong.

"The first delivery was fully pre-ordered and we'll probably need to wait couple of weeks before we have 3310 widely avail-

able in our stores," said Jan Virkki, head of consumer products at Finland's largest telecom operator Elisa.

The nostalgic appeal was clear.

"It looks like the brick, like the ones we had when we were kids," said student Oona Patomaki, walking by Nokia's store in downtown Helsinki.

While operators and retailers in other countries - including

Britain's Carphone Warehouse - have echoed Elisa's message, the precise level of consumer appetite is difficult to estimate as HMD did not give any sales figures.

"In the UK, initial sales have been very strong, and that's a pretty good achievement because this is a very basic phone, it doesn't even have Wi-Fi on it," said Ben Wood, analyst at CCS Insight.

Three new Nokia smartphones running on Google's Android platform are due to go on sale in upcoming weeks and the hope is that the 3310 will whet appetites.

"The mid-range Android smartphone space is probably the toughest of the mobile phone markets in existence... This is their challenge, and HMD needs to quickly move the market forward," said Wood.

## Nestle invests in L American factories, creates 2900 jobs

SWISS-BASED FOOD company Nestle SA is creating thousands of jobs and investing in new factories in Latin America as it looks to tackle social issues and shore up its position in one of its strongest markets, the regional head said on Tuesday.

The maker of Kit Kat chocolate bars and Nespresso coffee is working with government officials in the four countries that are members of the Pacific Alliance trade group -- Chile, Mexico, Peru and Colombia - to create 2,900 jobs for young people over three years and teach job-hunting skills.

"Our view on corporate responsibility is that to make it sustainable we have to do it in a way that is embedded in our business model. Integrating young people can help us shape our company at a time of digital revolution," the company's Americas head Laurent Freixe said in an interview with Reuters on Tuesday in Chilean capital Santiago.

"We're not proposing the jobs just to do good for society. Our business is developing and we have real needs."

## Snowden says democracy under threat by attacks on 'fake news'

DEMOCRACY AND POLITICAL legitimacy are increasingly under threat from attacks by politicians like US President Donald Trump on "fake news" and free speech, former US National Security Agency contractor Edward Snowden told a conference on Tuesday.

"The costs of democracy is illegitimacy, and though none of us have wished for this, it is increasingly near," Snowden told

the Estoril Conferences, a meeting held this week in Portugal on human rights and migration.

Snowden was speaking through video link from Moscow, where he has been in asylum since 2013 after he revealed secret details of surveillance programs by US intelligence agencies. Many civil rights activists see him as a hero, but at home in the United States he is wanted to stand trial for espionage.

He said the world stood at the "crossroads of history", warning

that the direction it is heading now is "paved with fear, therein lies the world of walls, literal and figurative." He said surveillance programs by governments of their citizens, "the denunciation of inconvenient journalism as fake news and the prosecution of those who are speaking facts," represents a world of fear and political illegitimacy.

A government willing to trade public awareness for political comfort may rule, but they do not lead," he said.

## Blame game for cyber attacks grows murkier

VETERAN ESPIONAGE RESEARCHER Jon DiMaggio was hot on the trail three months ago of what on the face of it looked like a menacing new industrial espionage attack by Russian cyber spies.

All the hallmarks were there: targeted phishing emails common to government espionage, an advanced Trojan horse for stealing data from inside organi-

zations, covert communication channels for grabbing documents and clues in the programming code indicating its authors were Russian speakers.

It took weeks before the lead cyber spying investigator at Symantec, a top US computer security firm, figured out instead he was tracking a lone-wolf cyber criminal.

DiMaggio won't identify the name of the culprit, whom he has nicknamed Igor, saying the case is a run-of-the-mill exam-

ple of increasing difficulties in separating national spy agency activity from cyber crime. The hacker comes from Transnistria, a disputed, Russian-speaking region of Moldova, he said.

"The malware in question, Trojan.Bachosens, was so advanced that Symantec analysts initially thought they were looking at the work of nation-state actors," DiMaggio told Reuters in a phone interview on Wednesday. "Further investigation revealed a 2017 equivalent of the

hobbyist hackers of the 1990s."

Reuters could not contact the alleged hacker. The example highlights the dangers of jumping to conclusions in the murky world of cyber attack and defense, as tools once only available to government intelligence services find their way into the computer criminal underground.

Security experts refer to this as "the attribution problem", using technical evidence to assign blame for cyber attacks in order to take appropriate legal and po-

litical responses.

These questions echo through the debate over whether Russia used cyber attacks to influence last year's US presidential elections and whether Moscow may be attempting to disrupt national elections taking place in coming months across Europe.

The topic is a big talking point for military officials and private security researchers at the International Conference on Cyber Conflict in Tallin this week.

# Ex-TSA boss in running for FBI director

A FORMER TRANSPORTATION leader among the latest candidates President Donald Trump is considering for FBI director.

White House press secretary Sean Spicer said Trump on Tuesday met former TSA administrator John Pistole as well as Chris Wray, a former top Justice Department official who has served as New Jersey governor Christie's personal lawyer.

Trump is still on the hunt for a new FBI director three weeks after he fired James Comey. Before he departed on his first overseas trip, which ended Saturday, Trump met former Connecticut

said the president would continue to meet with candidates 'until he finds the right leader.'

Asked about the FBI vacancy, Keating said in an email to The Associated Press: "I remain interested and I remain comfortable with the President's widening of the circle. The more faces, the more opportunity for a solid choice. My fingers are crossed but I am satisfied with the process."

Pistole spent the more than two decades with the FBI, serving as deputy director for six years before President Barack Obama picked him to lead the TSA in 2010. He oversaw the transportation agency during a turbulent stretch as it sought to balance passenger privacy with safety.

He currently serves as presi-

dent of Anderson University in Indiana, where he earned a bachelor's degree in 1978.

Wray represented Christie during the investigation into the George Washington Bridge lane-closing case, in which two former aides were convicted of plotting to close lanes of the bridge to punish a Democratic mayor who wouldn't endorse the governor. Christie, who has informally advised the president, was not charged in the case.

Christie's office disclosed last year that Wray had the missing cell phone that was used by the governor and contained about a dozen text messages that Christie exchanged with a former staffer during a legislative hearing related to the bridge in 2013.

# Berlin court denies mom access to slain girl's FB account

A GERMAN COURT rejected a mother's demand on Wednesday that Facebook grant her access to her deceased daughter's account.

In the ruling, which overturned a lower court's decision, the Berlin appeals court said the right to private telecommunications extended to electronic communication that was meant only for the eyes of certain people.

Privacy remains a sensitive issue in Germany due to extensive surveillance by Communist East Germany's Stasi secret police and by the Nazi era Gestapo. Memories of espionage were stirred anew by Edward Snowden's 2013 revelations of spying by the United States.

In the Facebook case, the mother of a 15-year-old who was hit and killed by a subway train in Berlin in 2012 had sought access to her daughter's account to search for clues as to whether the girl had committed suicide.

Facebook had refused access to the account, which had been memorialised, meaning it was effectively locked and served as a message board for friends and family to share memories.
