ACB Files Case Against 3 Firms Providing Security To Govt Hosps For 'Irregularities'

Under-Deployment Of Staff, Bribery Among Complaints Bharadwaj flagged 'corruption' several

Delhi: Anti-Corruption Branch (ACB) has registered a case against three companies that were supplying security personnel to various Delhi govt hospitals. The action was taken after it received several complaints alleging under-deployment of staff, recruitment of ineligible candidates, fraudulent claims for ESI and provident funds, bribery by employers and embezz-

lement of govt funds. ACB chief Madhur Verma said that these companies provide security personnel at GTB Hospital in Shahdara, Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality Hospital in Tahirpur, BR Ambedkar Hospital in Rohini, SDN Hospital in Shahdara, Hindu Rao Hospital, and other Delhi govt hospitals. "During verification, it was found that these private players, in

Two of the complainants were working as security supervisors in these manpower and security provider companies.

ployment of security personnel at times, officials 'reluctant' to act: AAP

New Delhi: Delhi govt on Monday said health minister Saurabh Bharadwaiflagged "blatant corruption" in the hiring of contractual manpower at hospitals and other facilities several times since his induction into the cabinet, but officials were "reluctant" to take decisive action.

The govt, in a statement, mentioned that Bharadwaj took the oath of office on March 9, 2023, and highlighted the corruption issue on March 30 of the same year. "A thorough inquiry should find out why officials had shut their eyes despite repeated reminders by the health minister. The strictest punishment should be given to those responsible for continuing this corrupt practice," the statement read.

Govt said the matter had been discussed "dozens of times" with the officers of

cretary. It was also thoroughly deliberated upon when Bharadwaj was the chairman of the Delhi Assembly's Petitions Committee, yet no action was taken.

"Even in the case of hiring contractual data entry operators, the minister has written on dozens of files about corruption. The file was moved to stop this practice of taking manpower through private contractors and suggested they are hired through a central govt's undertaking such as ICSIL. The policy was even passed by the Cabinet. For reasons best known to LG, even that decision has not been implemented," the govt claimed, adding that the minister sent a detailed note yet again on the issue a few days ago.

185 camps with high-quality waterproof BJP says Kejriwal govt must go; tents being set up for kanwariyas: Atishi allegations 'frivolous', says AAP

New Delhi: To ensure that kanwariyas don't face any inconvenience, Delhi revenue minister Atishi said on Monday that 185 camps were being set up across the city and each of them would be equipped with high-quality waterproof tents, medical facilities, clean water, toilets and furniture.

Addressing a press conference, the minister stated that AAP govt was "committed" to providing the best facilities for the Shiva devotees during the holy month of Sawan. She also called upon the people of Delhi to join in this religious endeavour and support kanwariyas in every

While the movement of

day, it is likely to peak by the end of July and culminate on August 2, with people bringing Ganga water from Rishikesh and Haridwar on foot and offe-

Atishi, in her press conference, said that kanwariyas would start arriving in Delhi from July 25 onwards, and all camps would be fully ready in

Shahdara districts are the entry and exit points for kanwariyas, most camps are being set up in these areas.

'Maximum38 camps are being set up in Shahdara district, while North East will have 29, Central will have 22, and East district will have 19. Kanwar camps are being set up in various other parts of Delhi too," said the minister, adding that about 15-20 lakh pilgrims pass through Delhi during this period.

Atishi said the revenue department had started preparing for kanwar camps from June itself and regular inspections were being conducted by her and senior Del-

stalling of development work in the city. "In "All preparations for setting Arvind Kejriwal's rule, only one development up kanwar camps in Delhi are has taken place in Delhi, which is corrup-

tion," Sachdeva said.

He said AAP recently made "guarantees"

where elections weto the people of Haryana, where elections were due later this year, but failed to fulfil the promises of opening 100 schools per year, 1,000 mohalla clinics and for providing free electricity and water.

'Delhi is labelled as the most polluted capital in the world. In the winter of 2023-24, the AQI was over 400," he added.

South Delhi BJP MP Ramvir Singh Bidhurisaid that "incompetence, deceit and corrup-

tion have become the hallmarks" of the AAP govts in Delhi and Punjab. "BJP will not let Kejriwal deceive the people of Haryana and will run an awareness campaign," he said. AAP countered the charges by

saying that Kejriwal was "staunchly honest" and had provided "transparent" governance, resulting in Delhi having a revenue-surplus budget although it offered several free schemes. It said BJP should stop indulging in "frivolous allegations"

'It's been more than 11 years since BJP MPs were given a chance by Delhiites. Can BJP name a single significant achievement during this period? Can BJP name one state under its governance that has a revenue surplus or provides free electricity?" AAP asked.

AAP charged that the people of India had seen through the "false promises" of BJP, such as the unfulfilled 'jumla' of depositing Rs 15 lakh in every citizen's account.

Camps 'found wanting' in northeast Delhi, govt says work in progress

New Delhi: The incomplete arrangements at kanwar camps in northeast Delhi and Shahdara have left the Shiva devotees on the annual march in disarray. The camps, intended to offer rest and convenience to 15-20 lakh devotees passing through Delhi, are grappling with teething problems.

When asked about the inadequate arrangements, Delhi govt explained that a significant number of kanwariyas was expected to arrive in the city from July 25 and that more than 95% of the kanwar camps were, therefore, only now being put up by the state govt and hadn't yet been inaugurated. These stopovers for the devotees will not become fully operational before July 25.

Speaking to TOI, the camp coordinators said there was a big footfall on the first day of the yatra on Monday. However, the lack of essential facilities, including tents, washrooms and medical help, indicated that there might be more inconveniences once the number of devotees started increasing in a couple of days.

The camps that are already running are still waiting for some amenities. Ratanlal, coordinator at Kanwar Mandir in Yamuna Vihar, told TOI, "Having organised these camps for three decades, I can see we are still lackingalot of facilities. The tent, which serves as the main sanctuary for the weary pilgrims, is absent despite our temple being the only one dedicated specifically to the







kanwar yatra. We can't ask striving to accommodate as

the exhausted devotees to sit many devotees as possible in in the rain. We are, therefore,

TOI's visit to several camps also showed that team of medical professionals had yet to be deployed. Some camps have reported receiving over 2,000 devotees, who often suffer from bruises and injuries while marching for long distances with heavy pots of Ganga water back to heir localities. Jwala Shar ma, coordinator of the Seelampur Kanwar camp, complained, "The govt has assured us of medical facilities at the camps but they are yet to be set up. The severity of the devotees' injuries forced us to

get a private doctor to disin-

fect their sores.'

The camps in northeast Delhi's Yamuna Vihar did not have toilets and sanitation facilities. The exhausted devotees rested on the littered concrete roads. In Dilshad Garden, the open sewers within the camps were a significant safety hazard. An organiser expressed worry saying, "The designated spot for our camp is fraught with danger, but we have no alternative but to make do with what we have. The safety of women and children in the camp is a matter of concern because when the crowd increases, anyone can stumble and fall into

these open sewers." There was accumulated garbage near some camps in Dilshad Garden, Seelampur and other areas. Despite assurances of Delhi Police about posting of security personnel in these areas, the absence of CCTV cameras at the camps and the lack of barricading on busy roads like Maujpur to Seelampur have also left the organisers worried about the safety and security of the



ART centre staff allege misbehaviour by AIIMS security

New Delhi: The staff and doctors at AI-IMS expressed outrage on Monday after the "in charge" and staff members of ART centre, dedicated to treating HIV patients, were allegedly mis-treated by hospital's security personnel.

They claimed that the security officer of the institute behaved like "goons" when they arrived at the centre, "weilding lathis and throwing around items lying there". The incident was strongly condemned by doctors and staff members.

The ART centre, managed by department of medicine, plays a crucial role in providing care and support to individuals living with HIV. The medical community at AIIMS demanded swift action to address the situation and ensure that such incidents didn't recur.

A video of the incident that surfaced on social media showed Neeraj Nischal, senior doctor from department of medicine, expressing his distress over the phone. He voiced his complaint regarding the "inappropriate conduct" of security personnel towards the female staff members at the centre. Nischal alleged that the security guards were "abusive" and "even resorted to throwing objects"

He claimed that attempts to reach the chief security officer were unsuccessful. The video also showed security gu-

ards stationed at ART centre. They were dressed in blue uniforms and carrying sticks, and one security officer was in a khaki uniform.

According to insiders, a free generic pharmacy has been granted a one-year extension and instructed to move to a new location, which is integrated with registration counters set up at ART centre. However, doctors claimed that this space had been allocated without prior consultation or official communication with medicine department.

The situation was eventually brought under control after almost three hours. The chaos affected the single-window counter that fulfils the basic needs of patients, including distribution of medicines. As a result, patients were forced to wait for an extended period.

A senior hospital official, who requested anonymity, acknowledged "the regrettable nature" of the incident and stated that the matter was being looked into.
